



PhD opportunities at UoL

Below is a list of PhD funding opportunities available for prospective doctoral students at the University of Liverpool.

University of Liverpool's internally funded Ph.D. scholarships and awards ([link](#))

The University is able to offer a range of PhD scholarships and awards to home and international students. A list of current doctoral openings and scholarships across all the departments is available at this link. Make sure to filter the research area by “Math and Computing” (for Computer Science) and “Arts & Humanities” (for Music).

North West Consortium Doctoral Training Partnership (Arts & Humanities, [link](#))

The north-west consortium is a network of local universities (Liverpool, Manchester, Salford, Keele, Lancaster, Manchester Metropolitan, RNCM) aiming to establish a centre of excellence in the arts and humanities. Researchers will be equipped with world-leading knowledge and skills appropriate to meeting the academic, professional and socio-economic demands of the twenty-first century.

North West Consortium Doctoral Training Partnership (ESRC, [link](#))

Same as before, but focused on a different range of social science disciplines, organised into 21 subject pathways.

Commonwealth PhD scholarships ([link](#))

Commonwealth PhD Scholarships are funded by the UK government to support high-achieving graduates from high-income Commonwealth countries who want to pursue doctoral study at a UK university. These scholarships prioritise candidates who wouldn't otherwise be able to afford UK tuition and those from under-represented backgrounds. The goal is to foster world-class research in areas related to sustainable development, ultimately developing future leaders and promoting collaboration between the UK and Commonwealth countries. China Scholarship Council Awards ([link](#))

The University of Liverpool, in partnership with the China Scholarship Council (CSC), offers a scholarship program for Chinese postgraduate research students. This program covers tuition and research fees, providing funding for up to 4 years. To be eligible, applicants must be Chinese nationals, meet CSC requirements, and have applied for a PhD program at the University of Liverpool. The application process involves applying to the university, completing a CSC application form, and submitting all required documents by the deadline. Successful applicants will be nominated to the CSC for final approval.
